Most importantly, we would like to acknowledge and thank each and every young Aboriginal woman that submitted something to the contest. Your strength, courage, and talent are simply amazing. We feel very honoured that young Aboriginal women from coast to coast decided to take part in this process. All of the submissions were heartfelt - from spoken word and visual art, to creative essays, stories, photography, all with a deep sense of truth-telling.

We received over 100 submissions from various Inuit, Métis and First Nations communities in English and French. It became clear that this opportunity means a lot to young Aboriginal women and that there are many, many strong, loud voices that need to be heard. Due to the high volume of submissions and the quality of work - these decisions were extremely difficult. For this reason, we are currently looking into publishing everyone's completed works in a book so that all their work can be honoured and shared widely, upon approval of each person. We will be in touch directly with everyone who submitted as we move forward with this process and this will only be done with the consent of the person who submitted their work.
